

HOST Wishlist

Winter Break Is Coming!

Winter Break is a vulnerable time for many college students. Some local campuses close their oncampus housing, leaving some students out in the cold. Other campuses charge extra fees for students to stay in their on-campus housing.

Winter Break is also a time of increased food insecurity for students. On-campus dining or food resources might be closed or limited, and meal plans may be suspended during the break. Some students may be too low on funds to purchase groceries or meals.


Here are ways you can support college students during winter break:

Host a Student: Offer housing for 4-6 weeks, beginning as early as November 21. Learn more on page 8.

Financial Contributions: Help by donating to HOST. \$80 covers one night in a hotel for a student, and \$270 pays on-campus housing fees for an NCSU student.

Gift Cards: Provide gift cards to stores, restaurants, and food/ride services to help students access food. Note that students use ride-hailing services for grocery store trips.

Your support can make a significant difference in ensuring that college students have a safe place to stay and enough to eat during the Winter Break.

I am just completing my first HOST experience with a lovely young grad student from India. She has been very appreciative of having a safe space to stay until her apartment is ready.

It was very easy to get vetted to become a host. And I did turn down the first offer I got since it didn't seem like a good fit for me at the time.

I have really enjoyed being here for this student's first American experience. I've enjoyed some good Indian food and helping her get settled in Raleigh. Having my guest has been like having a daughter!

I am retired and have enjoyed the company of my host student. I am planning on keeping in touch with her and being part of her American family.





A Message From Libby

HOST marked a significant milestone this fall, celebrating one year of service to college students. Since August 2022, we have connected eight students with host families who offered essential support. These partnerships varied from a few days to eight months, with most students staying for 4-6 months. HOST has also assisted 25 additional students with financial support for emergency housing and rental assistance to maintain or obtain permanent housing.

Our commitment to making a difference extends beyond the students themselves. Eight host households have completed the comprehensive HOST onboarding process, including interviews, home visits, and specialized host training.

The work continues! We are recruiting FIVE new host households for our upcoming New Host Training on Saturday, November 18th. If you have a spare bedroom in your home, now is the perfect moment to become a part of something transformative. Consider opening your home to a college student facing housing insecurity, offering them safety and stability to focus on their academic dreams.

Here is what hosting involves:

Private Space: Hosts provide a private bedroom, access to a shared or private bathroom, and use of a kitchen.

Location Flexibility: Hosts can live anywhere within Wake County and can rent or own their homes.

No Extra Burden: You don't have to provide meals or transportation for the student.

Set Your Terms: You decide when you can host and for how long.

Match Control: Potential host and student matches meet before any final decisions are made; you can decline any match that doesn't feel right.

Shared Expectations: The host and student create a Living Agreement together - a shared set of expectations and boundaries for living together.

Every hosting relationship offers variability and flexibility. Each host is different, each student is different, and each host-student relationship is different. Yet, it's these differences that make the host home model so magical. It's all about people connecting and building relationships to provide students with a safe and stable place to pursue their dreams.
